



Ouachita Parish Migrant Education Program

The Title I Part C - Migrant Education Program is a federally-supported program that provides supplemental educational services to eligible migrant children.

The purpose of the Migrant Education Program is to design and support programs that help migrant students overcome educational disruption, cultural and language barriers, social isolation, and other difficulties associated with a migratory lifestyle.

The Program's goal is to assist all migrant students in meeting challenging academic standards and achieving graduation from high school or a high school equivalency program and successfully transition to postsecondary education or employment.

Eligibility Requirements

To qualify for the Migrant Education Program, a child must have moved within the past 36 months across state or parish lines to enable the child's parent or guardian to obtain temporary or seasonal employment in an agricultural or fishing activity. A migratory child can include youth who themselves are migratory workers or spouses of migratory workers. The program serves children and youth ages 3 through 21 who have not graduated from high school or earned a high school equivalency certificate. There are no ethnic, income or language requirements to participate in the program.
